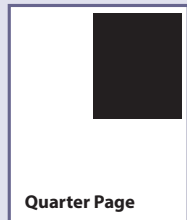
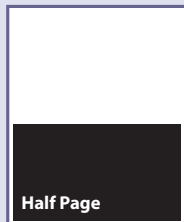
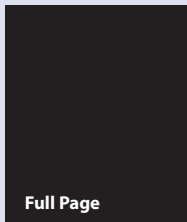

Queen Service Project Herefords in the City

As the 2026 National Hereford Queen, I am honored to introduce my service project, which will take place during the 2026 “VitaFerm” Junior National Hereford Expo (JNHE), “The Masters in Madison.”

My Service Project Inspiration

My service project was inspired by an experience that changed my perspective on agricultural education. While attending National 4-H Congress as the Tennessee State 4-H Beef Project Winner, I participated in a service project that took us into inner-city classrooms. Walking into those schools, I did not know what to expect. What I discovered, however, left a lasting impression. Many of the students I met had never seen a cow, never stepped foot on a farm and had very little understanding of where their food comes from. Yet when I began sharing my story of growing up as a fourth generation Hereford breeder, their curiosity quickly filled the room. Students eagerly asked questions about cattle, how calves are born, what cattle eat and how beef makes its way from pasture to plate. What impacted me most was not simply the opportunity to talk about agriculture, but the connection we created. In those moments, agriculture was not about rural versus urban lifestyles. Instead, it became a bridge, one that connected students to an industry that touches their lives every single day.

The experience that planted the seed:

Herefords in the City Bridging Agriculture and Urban Classrooms

Agriculture plays a vital role in every person’s life, yet many young people, especially those living in urban areas, have little exposure to farming or food production. Herefords in the City aims to help close that gap by bringing agricultural education and resources into classrooms that may otherwise have limited access to them.

As part of this project, I will be collecting and donating agriculture-themed children’s books to classrooms and school libraries in urban communities. These books will serve as long term educational tools, allowing students to continue learning about farming, ranching and cattle production long after a classroom visit ends. By placing these books directly into schools, we can help spark curiosity and create opportunities for students to better understand where their food comes from.

The book collection will take place during the 2026 “VitaFerm” Junior National Hereford Expo in Madison, Wisconsin. Junior Hereford members, families and supporters are encouraged to bring new or gently

used children’s books related to agriculture, farming or livestock to donate to the project.

Support from the National Hereford Women will play an important role in helping this effort succeed. Through social media promotion and assistance with collecting books during JNHE, NHW can help expand awareness and encourage participation across the Hereford family. In addition, I plan to work with state junior Hereford associations to promote the project within their states and encourage members to contribute to the book drive at JNHE.

While the collection will begin at JNHE, the impact of the project will extend far beyond. Each donated book represents an opportunity to introduce a student to agriculture and to the people who dedicate their lives to Agriculture.



At its heart, Herefords in the City is about planting seeds of curiosity, knowledge and appreciation for agriculture. By connecting students with the story of cattle production and the families behind it, we can help build a stronger understanding between urban children and the agricultural community.

I am incredibly excited to lead this service project and truly grateful for the support of Hereford families across the country who help make initiatives like this possible. Through your generosity and commitment to agriculture, we have the opportunity to share our story with students who may have never experienced it before. Together, we can make a meaningful difference by connecting young people to agriculture and sharing its story one classroom, one book and one student at a time.

Producer Spotlight Rocky Valley Herefords



Bob and Jan Coley of Rocky Valley Herefords in New Market, Tennessee are this issue's producer spotlight. This family has supported and served as leaders in the Tennessee Hereford Association, the Hereford breed, and the beef cattle industry.

How did you get your start in the Hereford Industry?

Our family started raising Hereford cattle in 1938 (before I was born). Coley Hereford Farm in Lafayette, Tennessee, was composed of 100 registered Hereford cows. We conducted annual production sales on the farm every year from 1952–1978. After my father's death, we had a herd dispersion in 1978. I selected two young cows from this sale and started my own herd.

Describe your operation:

Coley's Rocky Valley Herefords is composed of 15–20 brood cows with Line One pedigrees that calve in the fall of the year. We have a 70–acre farm in New Market, Tennessee (25 miles east of Knoxville). We breed our cows exclusively A.I. to Holden and Cooper bulls from Montana. We are a family operation, with my wife, Jan, and me as the only family members on the farm now, since our two children live out of state. Our daughter Kim is the Chief Advancement Officer of Habitat for



Humanity in Sacramento, California. Chad lives in Fort Thomas, Kentucky, with his wife, Dianna and their six-year-old twins,

Brooks and Baylor.

What philosophy or standards do you use to build the genetic base of your herd?

We continue to focus our breeding program on Line One genetics. The consistency and high quality that Line One cattle possess are the reasons we continue to use Line One herd sires. We select our A. I. sires based on moderate birth weights, calving ease, and growth traits as well as udder and teat scores. Jack Holden in Valier, Montana, has been a valuable resource to us for sire selections.

How do you market your cattle?

Bulls and heifers are sold by private treaty off the farm. The majority of our sales now are to repeat customers. We strive to produce heifers and bulls that will thrive on fescue pasture with minimum grain supplements.

What goals do you have for the future of your herd?

In the future, we plan to continue to improve our cow herd by selecting replacement females with excellent conformation, disposition, and acceptable Genomic Enhanced EPDs. Fertility is a must since we only use artificial insemination in our breeding program.

What is a "favorite" memory from your time in the Hereford Industry?

Some of my favorite memories from our past in the Hereford business were the annual production sales conducted on our farm. We would offer 60 – 70 head of Hereford bulls and heifers at auction on the second Saturday in March every year. The many people who assisted us in preparing for the sales every year, as well as the many local and national visitors who attended on sale day, became lifelong friends. I will never forget that



special "buzz" in the air on sale day and the actual auction under the tent behind the barn. (Oh yes, we halter broke all those cattle each year and led them through the sale ring.)

Do you have a special mentor(s) who has helped you in the cattle industry?

As a youngster, I was fortunate to grow up in a strong Hereford cattle environment. I was raised within a very close family setting with a younger brother (Jim) and two sisters (Carol and Bonnie). All four of us grew up on the farm and showed cattle throughout our 4-H Club years. All four of us graduated from the University of Tennessee. I was blessed that my home and farm background consisted of:

- A father who was recognized as an excellent cattleman, who was very knowledgeable with Hereford pedigrees
- A mother who knew how to manage the business of a cattle farm
- An uncle who was considered an expert in feeding cattle for their optimum performance
- And now a brother (Jim) who is always available for advice and support with our cattle operation.

You and Jan have served the cattle industry in multiple capacities over the years, including your day job. Can you highlight some of these experiences?

I spend most of my time as a veterinarian providing herd health services plus routine care for cattle producers. Coley Veterinary Services is a food animal veterinary practice serving primarily beef cattle clients in 10 counties in East Tennessee. This year will be my 48th year enjoying work as a large animal veterinarian. We also enjoy mentoring pre-veterinary students and veterinary medical students, primarily from the University of Tennessee.

Jan and I have been fortunate throughout the years to be very active in many state and local organizations. I was the first President of the Tennessee Cattlemen's Association as well as President of the Tennessee

Veterinary Medical Association. Jan was the first President of the Tennessee Cattlewomen's Association and served as President of the American Hereford Women and as President of the Auxiliary to the Tennessee Veterinary Medical Association. I have also been honored to serve on several advisory boards at the University of Tennessee.

Jan and I feel very blessed to have been involved in the Hereford business for our entire lives. It has been good for our family, and we are extremely grateful for all the friends that we have made along the way.

Tennessee Hereford Association Annual Meeting

The 2026 Tennessee Hereford Annual meeting was held in Lebanon, Tennessee, at the Wilson County fairgrounds on March 13, 2026. THA President, Josh Mansfield, welcomed everyone to the meeting. The steak dinner was provided by the Trousdale County Cattlemen's Association.

Bobby Singleton provided an Agribition sale update and explained that customer service plays an important role in marketing your livestock, "Friends buy from friends". AHA Director Jim Coley, who is serving the last year of his term and AHA Eastern Field representative Peyton Pruett brought remarks on behalf of the AHA. Peyton spoke of record-breaking cattle prices and made the point that a new bull is generally worth 3.5 feeder calves.

TCA Executive Vice-President, Dale Parker, introduced himself to the group and asked: "What does TCA need to do to serve you better?" He announced that the Tennessee Department of Agriculture would host three Tennessee Ag Enhancement Program listening group meetings: March 20 in Jackson, April 9 in Columbia, and April 10th in Knoxville.

Ella Callicott announced that Tennessee will be hosting the 2027 Southeast Regional Junior Hereford Show during her Tennessee Junior Hereford Association report. Eric Walker provided the current status of the Tennessee Hereford Marketing Program. Walker stated that the sale has gone from marketing a 1,000 head per sale to around 100 head per sale. The spring sale is on April 15, the outlook for the summer sale is doubtful, and the Fall sale is still scheduled.

The Tennessee Hereford Women President, Andrea Rushton, presented the Betty Walker Scholarship to Ella Callicott of Only, Tennessee. She encouraged the group to help promote interest in the Queen program, highlighting the success of former THA Queen and current National Queen Lauren Wingler.



Matt and Meredith Collins of Lewisburg, Tennessee, were named the THA Family of the Year in a special presentation by Stan Webster and Sally Wingler. The Collins family operates CN Cattle and has provided a positive influence to producers and youth with their service to the THA and the TJHA. RODNEY COBBLE: Rodney has been involved in the Hereford business and showing Herefords for many years. He currently serves as President of the East Tennessee Hereford Association. He welcomes the opportunity to assist at the state level in any way possible to help promote and strengthen this great breed.

JASON DAY: He and his family operate Day Ridge Farm in East Tennessee. Day Ridge runs about 85 cows, using embryo transfer and AI. Jason says he is passionate about the future of Hereford cattle and where this industry is headed. He stated, "The quality of the people in this breed is like none other. I am encouraged by the youth of today. I think we are in for a bright future in this industry."

EMILY POPE: Emily Pope, along with her sisters, Lauren Martin White and Ali Maitland, operates Martin Polled Herefords in Dyer, TN. The small herd of Hereford cattle began as a 4-H project in the early 1990s and continues today on the family farm. Replacement females and bulls are marketed off the farm and annually at the Southern Opportunity Sale. Emily works for the Natural Resources Conservation Service as a Soil Conservationist in Dyer County and is also very involved with her husband and his family's full-time row crop and commercial cattle operations.

RYAN PROFFITT: Ryan and his wife, Amanda, own and operate RP Cattle Co. in Boones Creek, Tennessee. They run a commercial and a registered Hereford cow-calf operation. They are improving their genetics utilizing embryo transfer and AI. He has been raising Hereford cattle for over fifteen years. Ryan says he looks forward to serving and bringing ideas for the future of the Tennessee Hereford Association.

The new board met that evening to elect the 2026 officers. The following were elected: Sally Wingler, President, Stan East, Vice-President, and Kay Coley, Secretary-Treasurer.

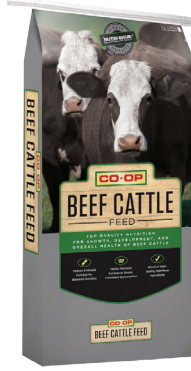

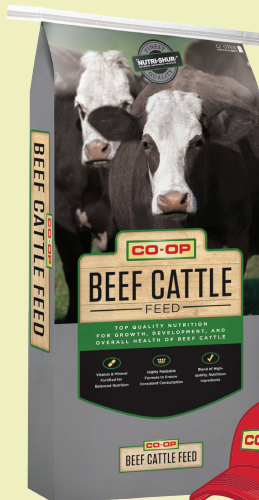
