


A Word from our President

THA Annual Meeting Report

The 2023 Tennessee Hereford Annual meeting was held in Lebanon, Tennessee at the Wilson county fair grounds on March 8, 2024. THA President, Zachary Hopkins welcomed everyone.

The family of the year award is always a highlight of the meeting. Stan Webster came forward to give the introduction and present the award to Sally Wingler and family.

Sally grew up in the Hereford industry and has dedicated much of her adult life to promoting the Hereford breed. She has been involved in all aspects of the Tennessee Hereford Association, has served as a board member for the National Junior Polled Hereford Association, and currently serves as the American Hereford Women President. We will learn more about the Winglers in the August issue.



Annual reports were given for the Tennessee Junior Hereford Association, the Tennessee Hereford Marketing Program, the State Hereford Show, and the Tennessee Newsletter. Tommy Coley gave an update of AHA news. A sale preview was given from the sale manager, Bobby Singleton.

The Hereford Women of Tennessee made several presentations. Allie Harrison received the Hereford Women Scholarship. Outgoing THA Queen Madison Maupin was presented with a plaque of appreciation.

Josh Mansfield and Richard Brown spoke about the Tennessee Hereford Marketing Program. They announced their will be an additional summer sale added on July 10, 2024. It was also noted that a group of steers from the Fall sale were the only ones that did not go off feed this January after a major snowstorm.

Two directors rotated off the board this year. Bob Coley, and Zachary Hopkins had fulfilled two full terms on the committee and were not eligible for re-election. The election determined that the following were elected as directors to serve three-year terms:

Sally Wingler - Sally is the current office manager for the Tennessee Cattlemen's Association and President of the American Hereford Women. She and her husband Russ operate a small cow-calf operation in Christiana.






